





ITE-EAE

Application period 21 May – 28 May 2024

- Apply for up to 3 course choices. Courses with the same title at different ITE Colleges are counted as separate choices.
- write-up of not more than 100 words for each course choice.
- List down talents, aptitude, achievements, passion and interests relevant to the course, including:
 - Portfolio of related works / projects
 - ➤ Participation in MOE Elective Modules, Applied Subjects, ITE Skills Subjects, and/or ITE Elective Modules Participation in work attachments, community/volunteer work, school/personal activities/projects, CCAs and competitions
 - > Relevant work experience

POST-SECONDARY PATHWAYS 4 MAIN TRACKS

1. Junior Colleges (JCs) or Millennia Institute

Prepares students for the GCE
'A' level examination



4. Private Schools & Institutions (LaSalle/NAFA etc)

Curriculum is determined by the school and alternative options are provided for students

2. Polytechnics

Trains students with relevant skills for the workplace in a knowledge-based economy.

3. Institute of Technical Education (ITE)

Equips students with technical knowledge and skills relevant to the industry.

Interactive filters allow students to explore courses based on aggregate type, score and field of study and shortlist courses. Students can also access the course's minimum entry requirements, details about the course (modules and career prospects), etc.
School Finder (www.moe.gov.sg/schoolfinder)	Find school information such as contact details, JAE aggregate score range, subjects offered, CCAs and programmes offered by the junior colleges and Millennia Institute. Interactive filters allow students to shortlist schools based on their considerations, such as electives and programmes, subjects.



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
